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خلاصه مقاله:

Since ages, philosophers, literary men, and clergymen had different positive or negative viewpoints towards death and after-life. John Donne, the English metaphysical poet, has shown a positive and runty view of death in his various works and especially in his sonnet number 10 called death, be not proud ; and using paradox, has asked death to die.Also, Fereydoon Moshiri, the Iranian contemporary poet, in addition to his opposing positive and negative views in his various works, has shown a special enthusiasm towards death and after-life, and regards death as a sweet sleep in his poem why fear death? , which is an adoption from Donne's above mentioned sonnet.
